

2021-2022 Governors Teacher Salary Increase Allocation

- In 2020-21 Fiscal Year the legislature appropriated \$500 Million for Teacher Salary Increase Allocation (TSIA) within the Florida Education Finance Program
- From these funds 80% was to be used to increase the minimum base salary for all “full-time classroom teachers’ as defined in 1012.01(2) F.S. to \$47,500 or the maximum amount achievable.
- The remaining 20%, were to be used to provide salary increases to any full-time classroom teacher who did not receive an increase from the 80% allocation or received an increase of less than 2%, as well as any other full-time instructional personnel, as defined in 1012.01(2) (b)-(d), F.S.
- The 2020-21 allocation brought the Leon County Schools minimum to \$43,304.
- The legislature has continued the TSIA funding for 2021-22, increasing the total allocation by \$50 million for all Florida Districts.
- LCS’ new allocation is \$435,774 for the 2021-2022 school year.

Therefore, the Leon County School Board would like to propose the following:

- New minimum for teacher salaries \$43,695. Increase of \$391.
- 20% allocation brought Instructional Personnel not defined as a “full-time classroom teacher” as defined in 1012.01(2) F.S. to bring the minimum to \$43,695 or \$31 added to the base of those exceeding the new minimum.
